



FOKKER B. II

The B. II was one of four basic types of flying-boats and amphibians developed in the years between 1922 and 1930. The B-series could be equipped for either military or civil roles. All types featured a dural hull and wooden wings.

The B. II, smallest of the four, was a light reconnaissance sesquiplane flying-boat with one 360 h.p. Rolls-Royce 'Eagle' VII engine with tractor-propeller. The top wing was fabric-covered, the lower one was completely plywood covered.
